Rules of the Month

This month's rules are from the Outdoor Range Rules.

Rule #17: Human silhouette targets are not permitted upon the ranges.

Rule #18: A maximum of 7 rounds can be loaded into any firearm regardless of clip, magazine or tube capacity.

Rule #19: No Rapid Fire.

Recipe of the Month

Perch Chowder

Ingredients:

- 3 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 large yellow or white onion, about 2 cups, chopped
- 1 1/2 pounds Yukon Gold or other waxy potatoes, peeled and diced
- 1 quart fish or clam stock
- 2 cups water
- 1/2 teaspoon marjoram
- Salt and black pepper
- 1 1/2 pounds skinless yellow perch fillets, cut into chunks
- 6 to 8 ounces Polish kielbasa, sliced
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh dill or parsley
- 1 cup sour cream, served tableside

Directions:

- Melt the butter in a Dutch oven or other heavy pot over medium heat. When it stops frothing, add the chopped onion and cook gently until it's soft and translucent. Do not let it brown.
- Add the potatoes and coat with the butter. Cook for 1 to 2 minutes to let the butter absorb a bit. Sprinkle everything with salt. Pour in the fish stock, water and marjoram and add salt and pepper to taste. Simmer gently for about 20 minutes, or until the potatoes are tender.
- Once the potatoes are tender, add the perch and the kielbasa and simmer another 10 minutes. Turn off the heat and add the dill.
- Ladle into bowls and let everyone add sour cream to taste at the table. Serve with lots of beer and some crusty bread.
